### Looking at 2021-2022 City Budget

On Monday, June 21, the Independence City Council approved the City's Fiscal Budget for 2021-2022.

This year was particularly challenging due to budgetary impacts of COVID-19. Total revenues for the General Fund in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget are \$78,027,743 (including one-time American Recovery Plan funding). Revenue growth is primarily attributable to an estimated 1.5% increase over current fiscal year projected sales taxes revenues. Despite the loss of several major retailers in the last year, this increase is driven by the Use Tax waterfall provision. A total of \$448,000 in Use Tax revenues is expected to waterfall to the General Fund in the Fiscal Year 2021-22 Budget.

While the sales tax revenue has increased, other budgetary staples such as the Cable Franchise Fee, Telephone Franchise Fee, and Fines and Court Costs have continued to decrease.

To balance this year's budget as required by the Missouri State Constitution, a total of \$3,122,000 in one-time revenues from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) are contemplated for use in the General Fund. The City Council will face challenging decisions over the next year and a half to find further savings or new funding resources to maintain the constitutionally required balanced budget and a healthy fund balance for any future emergencies.

Due to this budget constriction and the lingering economic uncertainty presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, this budget does not include funding for many new programs or initiatives; instead, many of the items that align with the strategic priorities of Independence for All are funded through the ARPA.

General Fund changes of note include:

- \$20,063 for the addition of one part-time Detention Officer.
- Convert 6.0 Police Officer positions to Cadets to begin new recruitment program.
- Full-year funding for Vacant Building Registry Program.
- Full-year funding for Neighborhood Services Manager to build proactive code enforcement capacity.
- Increase of \$1,896,012 for Retiree Health Insurance.
- Continued consolidation of services to drive efficiency—all mowing and grounds maintenance will transition to Municipal Services in the upcoming fiscal year.

During the June 21 meeting, the Council approved an amendment to the proposed budget that will allow the City to reopen the National Frontier Trail Museum and adds additional funds for historic site maintenance and repairs.

They also approved the Expenditure Plan for funds received through ARPA which includes an additional \$300,000 to increase the Health Department budget. This increase is offset by reductions of \$285,000 to the abandoned vehicle enforcement program and \$15,000 for the housing study included in the Proposed Budget. ARPA funds will also be utilized to provide Police hiring incentives, public safety technology, infrastructure investments, and funds directed towards dangerous buildings and illegal dumping.

The new Fiscal Year runs from July 1, 2021, through June 30, 2022. Read the Proposed Budget at indep.us/proposedbudget2021.

## Loan program available

The Independence Home Energy Loan Program is a partnership between the City of Independence Power & Light Department (IPL) and the City Credit Union to provide low-interest loans to homeowners when they make energy efficient updates to their home. Loans can be up to \$15,000 and up to a 10 year term.

Owner-occupant residents in Independence can take advantage of the Home Energy Loan Program if they want to replace their current heating and cooling system, water heaters, add insulation to their home, replace windows and exterior doors that meet or exceed ENERGY STAR® specifications.

The process is simple:

- 1. The homeowner first submits a Home Energy Loan Application to IPL.
- Once approved, the homeowner will apply for the terms and conditions of the loan with the City Credit Union. The City Credit Union will notify the home owner of approval.
- The homeowner works with contractors from the approved contractor list. All contractors on the approved list are licensed and insured to work in the City of Independence and follow the Independence HELP requirements.
- 4. The contractor and homeowner schedule an installation date. Once the work is completed the homeowner notifies IPL to schedule for the Certificate of Completion to be completed.
- 5. The homeowner takes the Certificate of Completion to the Credit Union for proceeds to be issued to the contractor.

### Keep firework left overs out of our streams and waterways

While enjoying the 4th of July celebrations around your home or neighborhood this year, please remember to cleanup any trash from your firework display. Firework debris left on the ground, driveway or in the street pollutes our creeks and streams.

Fireworks contain plastics, heavy metals such as lithium and barium, nitrates, sulfur and other chemicals.

Firework debris can clog storm drains causing flooding. It is also a hazard for vehicles and pedestrians.



• Soak fireworks in water before they are thrown away

Remember the following:

- Never throw fireworks including smoke bombs into storm drains
- Use a broom to clean up smaller pieces
- Do not dump debris into the storm drain
- All storm drains drain directly to the creek
- Be a good neighbor and pick up after your celebration
